




State Capitol, Oklahoma City




A glimpse of Lake Lawtonka and Mount Scott



A gorgeous view of the Honey Creek arm of Grand Lake in northeastern Oklahoma—the lake, in all, covers 55,000 acres.




View of the beautiful Illinois river from the Point of the Pines near Talleguah.




Yes, this is in Oklahoma. It is a small section of Pearl canyon in the Salt Creek basin east of Canton between highways 8 and 58.

The tomb of Will Rogers, Oklahoma's most famous native son. This sacred place, at Claremore, has become a national shrine.

Salt Creek Canyon, north of Watonga, near Canton, Hitchcock and Okeene, is wonderfully scenic in its geological formations which glisten brilliantly in the sunlight. Served by highways 8, 51, 58.

Lake Texoma, near Tishomingo, Durant, Madill and Kingston, is a 140,000 acre lake. Superb fishing and boating. This lake is new. It is being developed into fine parks, playgrounds and vacation centers.

Mountain Fork river is viewed by many as Oklahoma's most scenic stream. Spring-fed, it flows swiftly at the foot-hills of pretty mountains. The view of the river shown here, taken near Hocketon, is duplicated a hundred times in McCurtain county.



Greenleaf lake, east of Muskogee, in the Coonson hills. One of Oklahoma's most popular resort centers for outdoor pleasure lovers.

Cedar lake, at the foot of the Winding Stair and Blue mountains in the Ouachita national forest, is a gem of natural beauty. A restful spot for camper and holiday picnickers.


The Will Rogers shrine at Claremore attracts many thousands of visitors representing all states. The shrine is on the hill the humorist had chosen for his own home.

Greenleaf lake, on highway 10 in the Coonson hills, is the gateway to Oklahoma's annual pilgrimage to dogwood blossom land. The lake is widely patronized as a resort.

Lake Murray, 6,000 acres of clear water, attracts countless thousands of visitors for outdoor fun each season. Fishing and boating are supreme.
