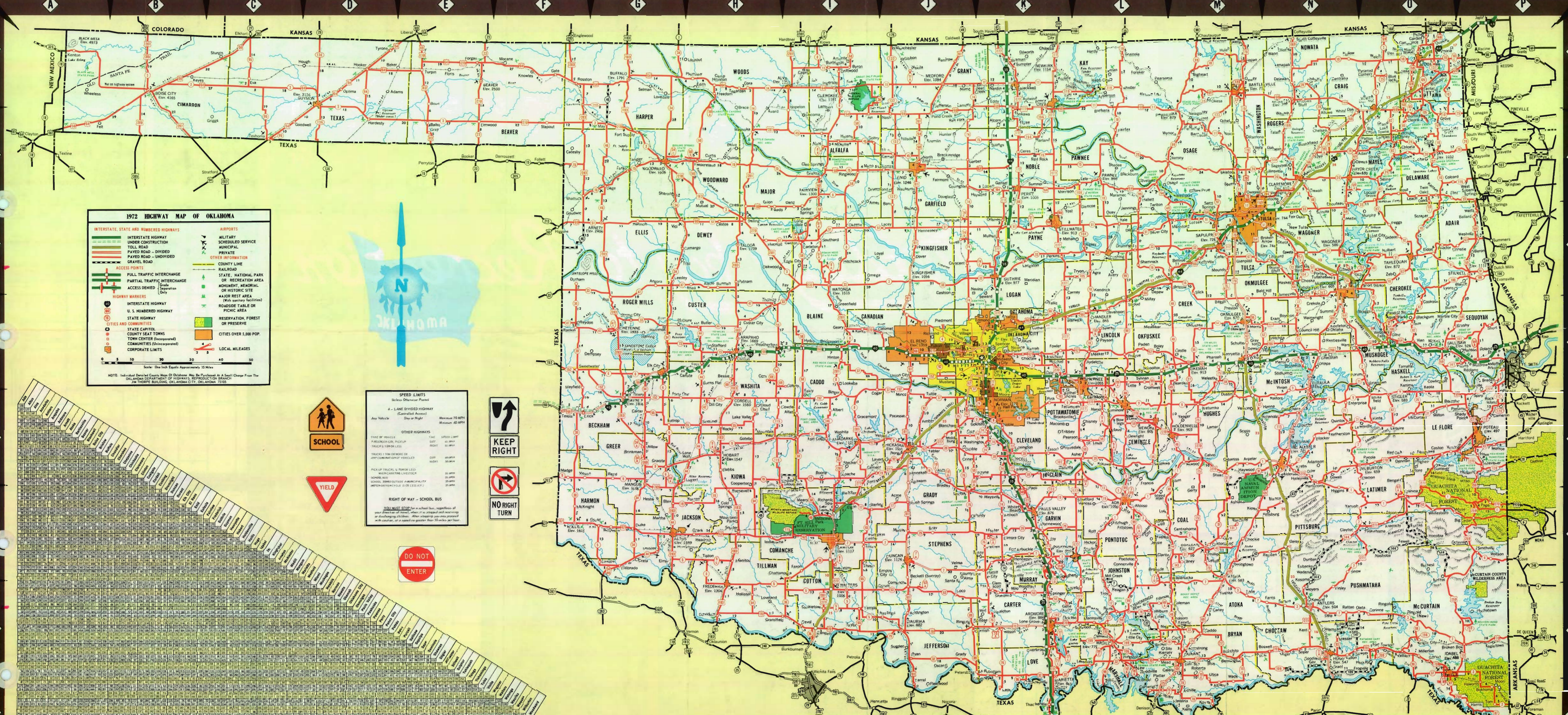

SPEED LIMITS

Below Observer Point

- 4 - LANE DIVIDED HIGHWAY (Controlled Access)
- Any Vehicle
- Minimum 75 MPH
- Maximum 40 MPH

OTHER HIGHWAYS

RIGHT OF WAY - SCHOOL BUS

YOU MUST STOP for a school bus, regardless of your direction of travel, when it is stopped and flashing red lights on its rear. After stopping, you must remain stopped until the school bus resumes travel. After stopping, you may proceed with caution, but at a speed not greater than 10 miles per hour.

SCHOOL **KEEP RIGHT** **NO RIGHT TURN** **DO NOT ENTER**
