PROJECT OVERVIEW

The Oklahoma Department of Transportation (ODOT), in cooperation with the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA), is conducting an environmental study for the proposed replacement of the US Highway 70 Bridge over the Union Pacific Railroad on the east side of Durant. Proposed improvements include replacing the bridge and widening the existing roadway. The purpose of the project is to improve the safety and efficiency of the facility.

ODOT, with the assistance of the consulting firm Tetra Tech, is in the process of conducting environmental studies to determine the best solution that would minimize impact on natural environment, as well as residents and existing businesses. Research during the studies will help determine a preferred alignment. The study will address a wide variety of issues, including, but not limited to:

- WNatural and cultural resources:
- Concerned property owners;
- *Adequate right-of-way preservation for future construction;
- Other issues.

The public will be provided the information it needs to understand issues surrounding the project and is encouraged to provide input. The public is encouraged to provide ODOT with written comments.
