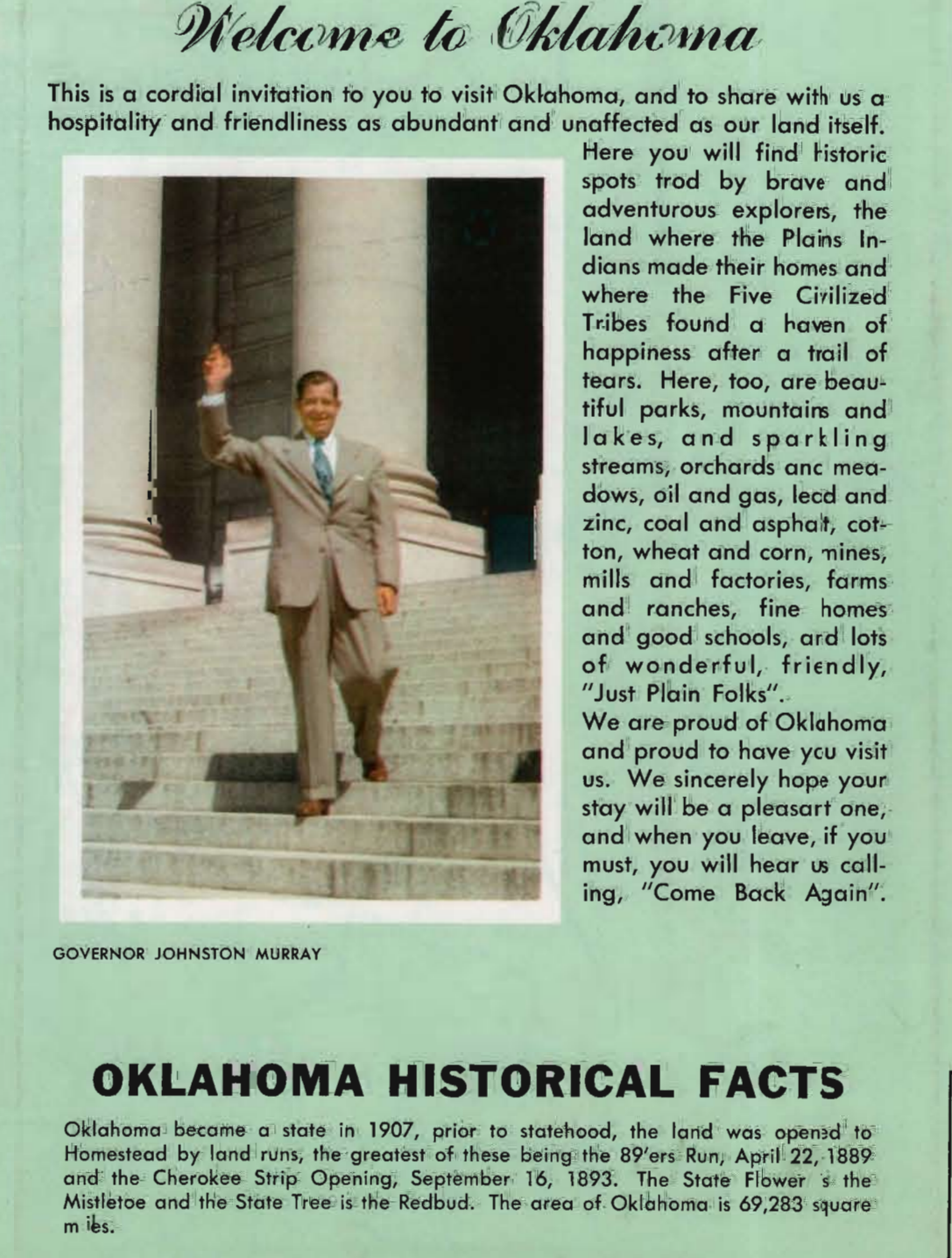
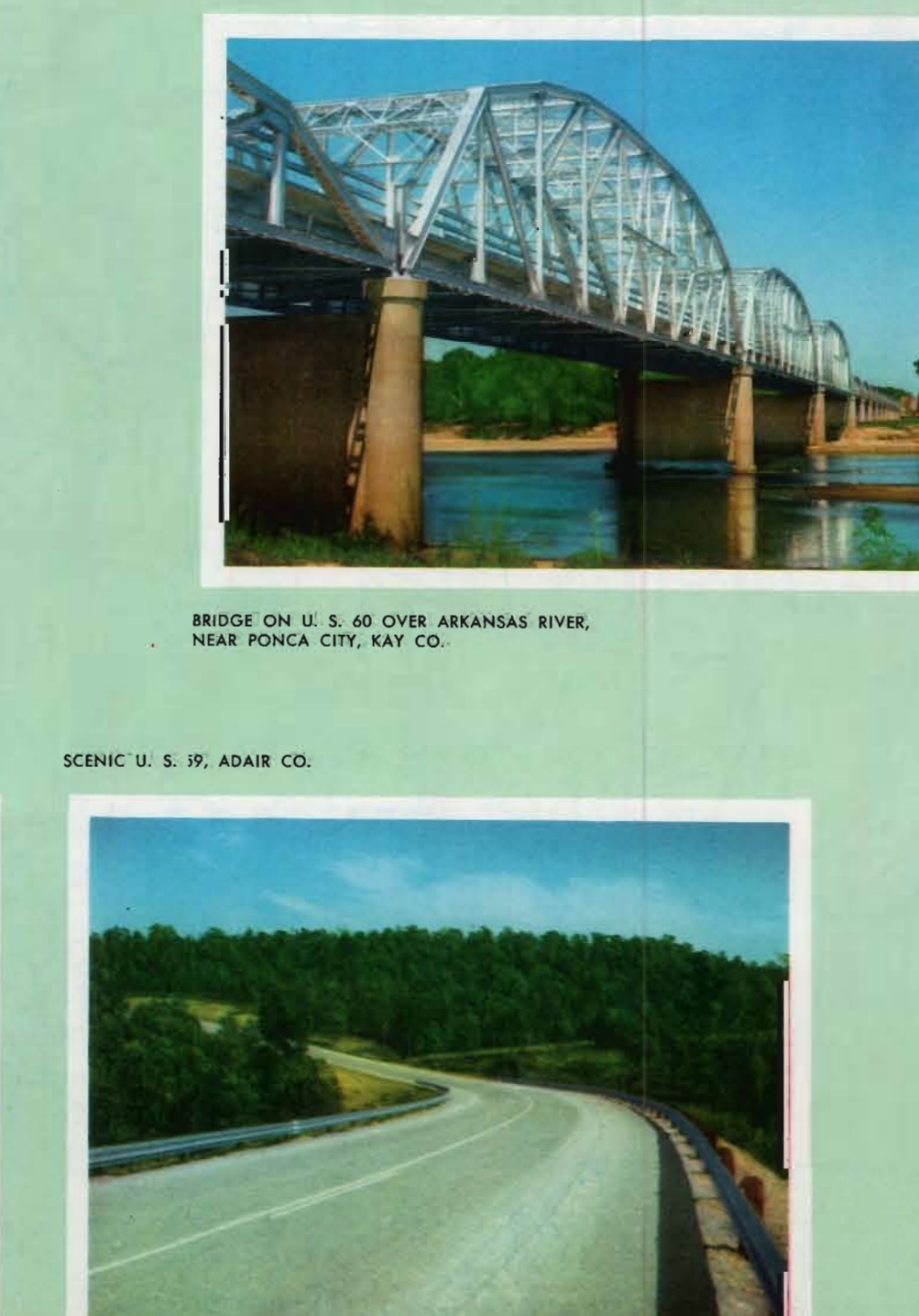

OKLAHOMA HISTORICAL FACTS

Oklahoma became a state in 1907, prior to statehood, the land was opened to Homestead by land runs, the greatest of these being the 89'ers Run, April 22, 1889 and the Cherokee Strip Opening, September 16, 1893. The State Flower is the Mistletoe and the State Tree is the Redbud. The area of Oklahoma is 69,283 square miles.
